

∞ LAYING ON OF HANDS

The Ordaining Bishop imposes his hands upon the head of the Bishop-elect. This ancient gesture, which expresses the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, is the heart of the Ordination Rite.

∞ PRAYER OF CONSECRATION

The Ordaining Bishop places the open Book of the Gospels upon the head of the bishop-elect; two individuals, one clergy, one lay woman (this is a symbolic expression of the synodal balance of the ancient Church), standing on either side of the bishop-elect, hold the Book of the Gospels above his head until the Prayer of Consecration is completed.

by the Holy Spirit Who lives in us.**

The entire assembly responds, saying:

✠ We welcome you as a shepherd of Christ's flock.
Build up the Church in unity and love,
so that the world may believe.

∞ KISS OF PEACE

The New Bishop greets the assembly, saying:

✠ **The peace of the Lord be with you always.**

✠ And also with you.

We will greet each other with a bow, maintaining physical distance.

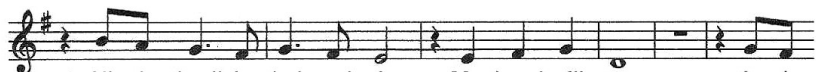

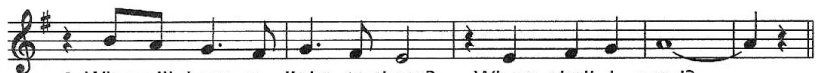
